Be it remembered, that Valentine Fleming Esquire, Attorney-General of Our Sovereign Lady the now Queen, who for our said Lady the Queen prosecuteth in this behalf, comes here into the Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace at Launceston in the Island of Van Diemen's Land, on the sixth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine and, for our said Lady the Queen, gives the Court here to understand and be informed:—THAT George Lunn late of Launceston in Van Diemen's Land, Labourer

on the nineteenth day of May in the twelfth year of the Reign of our said Lady the Queen, with force and arms, in Van Diemen's Land aforesaid, one umbrella of the value of one shilling

of the goods and chattels of one Joseph Brank then and there being found, feloniously did steal, take, and carry away, against the peace of our said Lady the Queen, Her Crown and Dignity.
