Clerk of the said Supreme Court on the Eleventh day of

declared Insolvent and Wednesday the ninth day of
March last past was ordered by the said George Browne for
a sitting of the said Court under the provisions of the
"Insolvent Estates Amendment Act No. 7" for the proof of debts

proceeding in the matter of the said Insolvency And whereas
at a sitting of the said Supreme Court under the provisions of
the last mentioned Act on the twenty third day of the said
Month of March an application was made to me for an
order of discharge and upon hearing the matter of such

that the said Insolvent had made a full discovery of and
surrender of all his Estate and Effects and the said Insolvent
