Whereas the above named Insolvent did present his Petition to the Honourable the Supreme Court of Tasmania praying amongst other things that he might be declared Insolvent under the provisions of the Act in Council of this Island intituled "An act to make provision for the more effectual distribution of Insolvent Estates" and the same having come on to be heard before George Browne Esquire Clerk of the said Supreme Court on the Eleventh day of February last past the said John Joseph Lucas was declared Insolvent and Wednesday the ninth day of March last past was ordered by the said George Browne for a Sitting of the said Court under the provisions of the "Insolvent Estates Amendment Act No. 7" for the proof of debts the Examination of the said Insolvent and for otherwise proceeding in the matter of the said Insolvency and whereas at a Sitting of the said Supreme Court under the provisions of the last mentioned Act on the twenty third day of the said Month of March an application was made to me for an order of discharge and upon hearing the matter of such application it having been made to appear to my satisfaction that the said Insolvent had made a full discovery of and surrendered of all his Estate and Effects and the said Insolvent having executed before George Browne Esquire Clerk of the said Supreme Court such Warrant of Attorney as by the said Act is in that behalf directed I do hereby make this my order in writing for the discharge of the said Insolvent


