



A PROCLAMATION.

I, THE Honourable SIR JOHN STOKELL DODDS, Knight, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Chief Justice of the State of Tasmania and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia, and Administrator of the Government of the said State of Tasmania and its Dependencies, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by Section Five of "The Residence Areas Act, 1900" (64 Vict. No. 30), and of every other power me in this behalf enabling, do, by this Proclamation, withhold and withdraw the lands respectively described in the Schedule to this Proclamation from the operation of Section Seven of the said Act.

Given under my hand, at Hobart, in Tasmania aforesaid, this eighteenth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and one.


