Tasmania formerly a Storekeeper SHEWETH:



1. THAT Harry Simco resides at Moonah in Tasmania which is within the Southern Electoral District and is a trader within the meaning of "The Bankruptcy Act 1870"

2. THAT the said Harry Simco is indebted to your Petitioner in the sum of Sixty eight pounds seventeen shillings and five pence for the balance of money due by the said Harry Simco to the said William John Turner for the trotting horse "Kinlough" a trotting sulky and harness a saddle and one set of scales and weights all sold and delivered by the said William John Turner to the said Harry Simco

3. THAT your Petitioner does not nor does any person on his behalf hold any security on the Bankrupt's Estate or on any part thereof for the payment of the said sum or any part thereof

4. THAT the said Harry Simco has committed an act of : - Bankruptcy within six months before the presentation of this Petition

5. THAT the act of Bankruptcy committed by the said Harry Simco was that execution was issued against the said Harry Simco on a summons issued out of the Supreme Court of Tasmania at Hobart in Tasmania in its Local Courts Act Jurisdiction by Saxby Vincent Lord for the purpose of obtaining payment of not less than Fifty pounds to wit the sum of Sixty pounds five shillings and the said execution has been levied by seizure and sale of the goods of the said Harry Simco
