2. That on the fourth day of November last I received from my said Agents a telegram a copy of which is hereto annexed marked "A" and replied by telegram dated the same day a copy of which is hereunto annexed marked "B".

3. That on the Sixth day of November aforesaid I received from my said Agents a telegram a copy of which is hereunto annexed marked "C".

4. That I subsequently received from my said Agents a letter -- confirming the said Telegrams.

5. That on the Thirteenth day of November last (the date fixed by the Registrar first Resolution of Creditors) the second general meeting of Creditors was held at Queenstown aforesaid wherein the said first Resolution was duly confirmed.

6. That I did on the said Thirteenth day of November last at Queenstown aforesaid post under cover properly stamped and addressed to my said Agents the said Resolution referred to in the preceding paragraph hereof for registration together with all proofs and proxies produced at the said Second Meeting.

7. That I was informed by my said Agents on the Fifth day of --

January last that the registration of the said resolution had not yet been effected.

8. That I have caused a search to be made in the Office of the Registrar in Bankruptcy but no certificate stating the grounds of his refusal to register the extraordinary Resolution has been yet filed with the proceedings.

9. That the above named William Henry Lewis under the belief that the said Resolution had been duly registered has paid to his Creditors the composition of Two shillings and six pence in the pound adopted at the said meeting but two of the said Creditors as I am informed by the said William Henry Lewis and believe returned the amount of composition forwarded to them.

10. That unless an Order be made that the said resolution be registered the said two dissenting parties will obtain an advantage over the other Creditors and one of the said dissenting Creditors will proceed to sell the said Debtors stock under a seizure made under an execution issued out of the Supreme Court on the Thirty first day of December last notwithstanding that he had received prior to such seizure notice of the filing of the Petition herein made under "The Bankruptcy Act 1870" and Rules thereunder made.

11.
