twenty six pounds fourteen shillings and nine pence which amount

by cash and as regards Sixteen pounds eleven shillings by the
delivery to the said Arthur Creese of a Promissory Note - The said
Alexander Ross then showed me receipts for the sum of Two hundred

and ten pounds three shillings and nine pence and for the said Promissory Note which had been given to him by the said Arthur Creese I know the handwriting of the said Arthur Creese from having frequently received orders and other communications from him and I say that to the best of my knowledge and belief such receipts were signed by him
