

all books papers and writings relating thereto as are now
in my custody possession or power - And I further
say that I have not removed concealed embezzled
or destroyed any part of my estate real or personal
nor any books of accounts papers or writings
relating thereto with an intent to defraud my creditors.
At the time of my bankruptcy I was carrying on
business at Tuanack as a farmer. I had been
farming at Tuanack for about thirteen years before
my bankruptcy. My father died about twenty years
ago. I have been working for my mother since
the death of my father. My mother died about

ten or eleven years ago. I know that I have a
H.R. life interest in ~~100~~³⁰⁵ acres of land under my father's
will. I have a life interest on one third of this.
There are three dwelling houses upon the property. Each
of my other two brothers has a like life interest in
the property to myself and each occupies one of the
dwelling houses. The 305 acres is mortgaged. I can't
say who made the mortgage. The mortgage is
to the Nat-Nat Life Assn for, I think, £300. The rate of
interest is 4%. Since my mother's death & ^{Palmer} ~~Barrett~~
the trustee receives £8 a year from each of my brothers
and myself. Some years I have paid this amount
to the Trustee & some years I have paid it to Mr
Heymouth & the other £1 was used for rates. I have
15 acres of land at Whiteford some of it is cultivated.
There is a mortgage on this for £20 to the Tasmanian
Finance Co. I can't say to what date the interest
on both properties is paid up. Under my father's will
I don't know that I had any interest in the personal
property. The personal property was sold I understand
to pay my father's debts. I can't say how much
of my 100^{acres} is under cultivation but I ~~should~~ say
~~readily~~ readily. for the property has never been divided. The
property is divided by fences for occupation purposes.
There is a wooden six roomed cottage upon my
100 acres and a stable built by myself. I am
now working at Borthwick for Chas Byrne. I have
been working for various persons from 18 July last.
Since I have been away from home the 100 acres
^{taken} occupied by me has been occupied by my wife
& family. She rented the property from the trustee
before I went out to work. She pays £8 a year &
takes which she pays to the trustee. She did not
arrange with me to rent the property. Mr Palmer

as far as I know relates the property from the trustee.
I don't know what stock my wife has on the
property I have none. I have no stock farming
implements money or other effects beyond what
is stated in my statement of affairs. I cannot
say of my wife has any stock or farming
implements. I have to support my wife and
children. The oldest child is about 3 years old there
are three children. I don't know what stock my
wife is running on the land. There are four sheep
running on the land belonging to Scott. Mr Roberts
~~left~~ lent me £20 at the Parattah Sale about. I think this
was longer than fifteen months ago. I did not say
that I wanted the money to pay for a mare and foal
I had bought from a man named Smith.
Mr Gibon was not present when I received the bill.
I did not mention anything about a mare & foal
when I borrowed the money. When ~~I borrowed~~ Mr
Roberts lent me the money I had some sheep
at the sale and I told him I was pushed for
money & wanted the money for the sheep he was
selling. Mr Roberts then lent me £20. Mr Roberts
applied the proceeds of the sale of the sheep to an
account of about £12 or 13. I received no
balance from the sale of the sheep. I owe him
the balance of my account still. I did not
mention a man named Smith when I later denied
Mr Roberts. I merely told Mr Roberts I was pushed
for money. If Mr Roberts says that I wanted
the money to pay for a mare & foal I purchased
from Smith it is not true. And if Mr Gibon makes
the same statement that also is not true. I had
not purchased a mare & foal at all at that time.
I know lots of Smicks at different places.

I did not know a Smith who had a mare & foal for sale. Of the £20 I paid £14 to Mr. Baker & Son ^{stet} and £6 to Mr. Murdoch & Son. I have never kept any account in a book or account at all in writing of my receipts & expenditure. I have some receipts with me. I have been earning 15/- a week at farm work besides my rations since I left home. I have lost a lot of time. My wages now at road making are 5/- a day & I have to keep myself. I support my wife & family. If my wife makes anything off the farm she keeps it. She has no crop in. I owe Mr. O'Connor a large sum of money all for goods supplied. I had 40 ^{or 45} acres of grain sown from seed I expected to pay Mr. O'Connor account - My crop failed & when I cut it I only got 12 tons of hay from it. There might have been a few acres besides the 40 or 45 acres of the part which I occupied under cultivation. I saw Mr. Roberts at Parattah at the sale yard. He gave me an order on Roberts & Sons for the amount. He gave me the bill at the settling up room at the Parattah Hotel. Mr. Gibson was not present. Neither at the sale yard nor in the Hotel at Parattah nor in any other room or place did I ask Mr. Roberts that he wanted £20 to pay for a mare and foal purchased from Smith ~~at least not that I am aware of and if Mr. Roberts says so it is untrue.~~ I have never at any time produced a bundle of notes & some gold and for the purpose of paying a man working for me his wages.
