DEBTOR'S SUMMONS.

YOU ARE SPECIALLY TO NOTE that the consequences, which will follow any neglect to comply with the requisitions contained in the summons, are that you may be adjudged a bankrupt on the petition of *the within named Ernest Tasma Tinning as trustee of the within named estate* should you not pay to, or compound with *him* for the sum claimed within *21* days from the service of this summons on you.

If, however, you are not indebted to the said *Ernest Tasma Tinning as such Trustee as aforesaid*

1.
