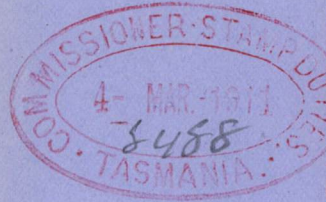

In reference to Messrs. Hamilton & Gills' Bills of Costs herein and which I am informed is liable to taxation on the lower scale, I beg to state that subsequent to the costs incurred relating to Liquidation proceedings-proper, I found it absolutely necessary to avail myself of the services of the Solicitors in connection with a dispute which arose as to ownership of the chief assets of the Estate, viz. the machinery, which was claimed to have been sold under a hiring agreement, thus necessitating extra care on the Trustees part in dealing with same, especially as we found it impossible to sell for cash, and had to fall back on a hiring agreement, which eventually was not carried through.

As I am of opinion that Messrs. 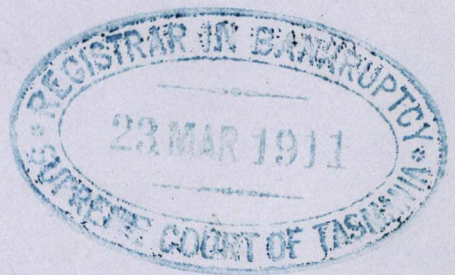

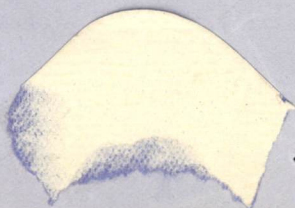

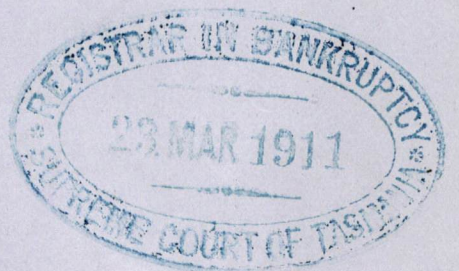
