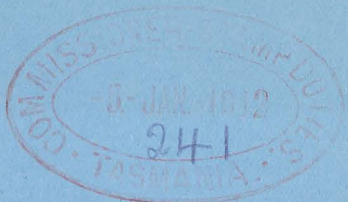

Burn and Son Auctioneers at their Mart Elizabeth-street Hobart on TUESDAY the 19th day of March 1907 at 12 o'clock noon unless this execution be previously satisfied.

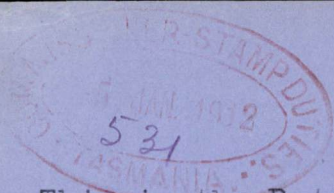

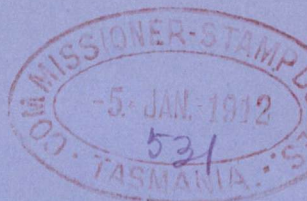
