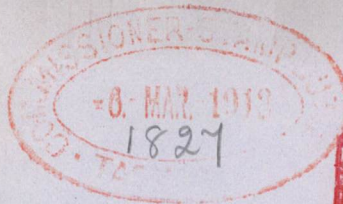

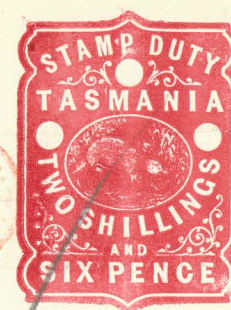
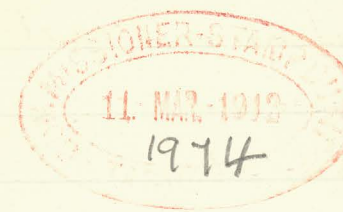

REGULATIONS UNDER "THE SHOPS CLOSING ACT, 1911" (No. 21, 1911).

Definitions.

1. In these regulations—

"The Act" means "The Shops Closing Act, 1911."
"Warden" includes Acting-Warden.

Proceedings Applicable to Poll.

2. The following regulations shall apply to every poll in any municipality to be held pursuant to Section 4 of the Act.

3. The poll shall, *mutatis mutandis*, be conducted in the manner provided by Parts IX. and X. of "The Electoral Act, 1907."

4. The poll shall be held on such day as the council of the municipality may fix.

The council shall cause a notice of the poll to be advertised in a daily newspaper circulating in its municipality not less than seven nor more than 21 days before the taking of the poll.

Such advertisement shall state the hours during which and the place or places at which the poll will be taken.

5. For the purposes of the poll the council of the municipality may appoint and abolish polling-places.

purposes of "The Public Health Act, 1903"; (4) a Special Rabbit Rate of One Penny and One Halfpenny in the Pound for the purpose of the destruction of rabbits in the Municipality; (5) a Water-supply Rate of One Shilling and Sixpence in the Pound, as provided for by "The Campbell Town Water-supply Act, 1908"; (6) a Codlin Moth Tax of Two Shillings per acre on every orchard situate within the Municipality for the purposes of "The Codlin Moth Act, 1888." 
