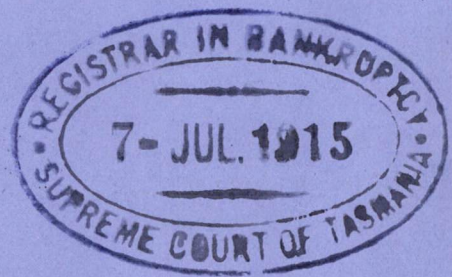

on the eleventh day of May paid them one of such monthly instalments  
(the receipt for which is now produced and shown to me and marked "A")  
the said Gustav Adolf Dehle had just then notified her that the -  
Applicants would not let her go out of Tasmania. Up to the moment



that my wife informed me of her indebtedness to the Applicants I was not aware that she was indebted to any person in any amount whatever.

6. THAT immediately after the conversation with my wife referred to in the last preceding paragraph I entered the warehouse of the Applicants when the said Gustav Adolf Dehle said to me "Do you know Mrs Cooney owes us a considerable amount of money and the position she is in? We put her in as bailiff and she sold our goods and is going away. Good God man you see the position she has placed herself in, she can be put in gaol for larceny as bailee." I knew nothing of any proceedings that had been taken against her save as then stated by the said Gustav Adolf Dehle from whose threatening manner I understood the Applicants now intended to forthwith prosecute her criminally. I thereupon said "Can't I do something" when the said Gustav Adolf Dehle replied "What about your property, you've got property at New Town - what about that." I answered "I've got a deed up at Elliston's I'll give you that."

7. The said Gustav Adolf Dehle and I then proceeded to the office of C. H. Elliston & Son and on the way my wife not being then present - Gustav Adolf Dehle said my wife owed the Applicants one hundred and thirty pounds, but that she had owed them as much as two hundred and fifty pounds, and he added "We should have told you but she had said 'don't tell the old man'."

8. At the office of C. H. Elliston & Son my title to land and cottage at Brighton was produced and on the said Gustav Adolf Dehle being informed that it had been insured for one hundred and fifty pounds he said "Oh well that's good enough." The said Gustav Adolf Dehle and I then left and within a few minutes of my return to my then place of business in Harrington Street he came to me with a paper writing in the words and figures following :-

"To Messrs Dehle Heritage & Co

Dear Sirs,  
In consideration of your agreeing not to put the bailiff in the shop and premises lately occupied and sold by my wife at Collins street, Hobart, I undertake to give you a 1st. mortgage for



£131/17/- and interest at 6% per annum over land and premises at Brighton owned by me, the deeds of which are now in the hands of Mr V. D. Elliston, solicitor and I promise to hand you the deeds of the said property through Mr Elliston and to instruct him to that effect.

The said Gustav Adolf Dehle referring to the said paper-writing said "Just sign this" - I signed it - I did not read it nor did he read it to me, I took it for granted that I was signing an agreement to give security over my Brighton property to save my wife from being put in gaol by the Applicants. - At the time I signed the said paper writing my wife had no shop nor premises anywhere she having sold her business as the Applicants then knew.

9. THAT neither at the time I agreed to hand to the Applicants the said title deed nor at any other time was mention of any agreement not to put the bailiff into any shop or other premises then or at any other time occupied by my wife. And the statement in the - undertaking brought to me by the said Gustav Adolf Dehle that I was to give a mortgage over the land at Brighton in consideration of the Applicants agreeing not to put the bailiff in the shop and premises lately occupied by my wife is absolutely false. I agreed that the said title deed should be handed to the said Gustav Adolf Dehle to keep the Applicants from criminally prosecuting my wife and for nothing else. From the time that I first spoke to the said Gustav Adolf Dehle as mentioned in paragraph 6 of this my affidavit - including our visit to C. H. my indebtedness to them and immediately after the said Gustav Adolf Dehle had obtained a promise from me that the Applicants should have the title deed to the said property I informed the said creditors of what had taken place in respect of such title.

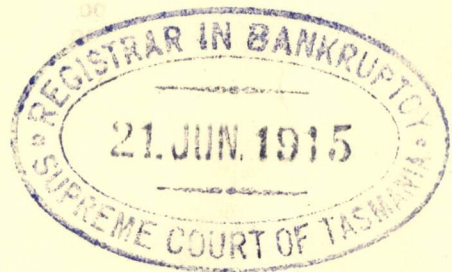


