

Reginald Harold Johnson says:-

The statement shows the whole of the assets.

They are under rather than over valued.

The liability to W. S. Bell & Co is about £8.

£15 is gross value of goods at their place.

£3-2-6 is owing on the goods at W. S. Bell & Co.

I have no one behind me prepared to guarantee a composition.

I want to get a clearance so as to free to go ahead.

My downfall is partly owing to Kwarua Soap Co, partly to Buckley Harvester and Draxman company agencies being withdrawn.

The soap company could not supply goods to fulfil orders I took.

Offer of compromise was made in view of reforming of Kwarua Soap Co.

I was to have their agency.

I cannot get their goods now. They will not supply.

I have taken orders for them, and we spent money in advertising.

I used the money I made from Western Australian Draxman Company in building up my other business.

The manager of the W. S. Bell Company came over and deprived me of my agency, and afterwards offered it to me again on the same terms.

Two months afterwards they again broke their agency agreement.

I am claiming damages from the
Kiwarua Soap Company. I have received
no dividend yet

I made an offer of £5 per month on strength
of getting soap agency agent.

I cannot say I told my solicitor of that.

I made the offer because I knew my earning
ability.

My present earnings are £5 a week. I net
about £4 a week. I have a wife & four
children to keep.
