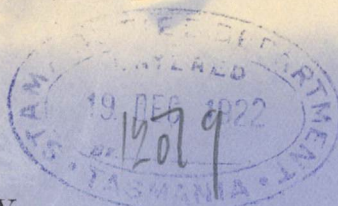
If, however, you are not indebted to the said


