For the purposes of the Workers' Compensation Act 1927, members of the full time hospital staff are authorised, on the authority of the Medical Superintendent, or other person in charge of the hospital for the time being, to attend accidents, disasters or other emergencies outside the hospital precincts and to travel in public or private transport as required. Such attendance and travel to be taken as being in the course of their normal employment by the Board of Management.'
