### SMITHTON PUBLIC HOSPITALS BOARD

#### BY-LAWS

BY virtue of the provisions of section 51 of the Hospitals Act 1918, the following amendment to the by-laws approved by the Board at a meeting held on the eleventh day of December 1959 and gazetted on the eighth day of May 1961, is hereby made:—

(a) Sub-paragraph (26) of paragraph 3 of the principal by-laws is amended by adding at the end thereof the following new sub-paragraph:—

'26 (a). For the purposes of the Workers' Compensation Act 1927, members of the full time hospital staff are authorised, on the authority of the Medical Superintendent, or other person in charge of the hospital for the time being, to attend accidents, disasters or other emergencies outside the hospital precincts and to travel in public or private transport as required. Such attendance and travel to be taken as being in the course of their normal employment by the Board of Management.'
