Speedcubing: Saturday 19 August 10:00am-12:00pm

Speedcubing is a competitive sport that involves solving various types of Rubik's Cubes and other twisty puzzles as quickly as possible.

The goal of speedcubing is to solve the puzzle in the shortest amount of time using a methodical approach. Speedcubers employ different solving methods and algorithms to optimise their solving speed. These methods typically involve layer-by-layer or block-building techniques that aim to reduce the number of moves required to solve the puzzle.
