




Make your own zine!

Be part of the story during Tasmania Reads and share your story in a zine. It's easy to make your own.



What is a zine?

A zine is a handmade booklet or 'mini magazine' for anyone of any age to share stories, ideas, opinions or art.

How do I make a zine?

It's easy – use the Tasmania Reads zine template and follow the simple instructions to fold and cut it. You will end up with a booklet you can write or draw on.

What can I put in my zine?

Anything you want. Share a story or the art that matters to you. It can be serious or playful, a few words or a lot, drawings or art, expressed in any language... have fun!

Share your zine with others

You can submit a copy of your zine to your local library so others can read it there, or submit it to the State Library and Archives of Tasmania permanent special collection.

If you want to submit your zine, speak to a member of staff. (You can keep your original zine.)

Discover great local zines and zine creators at the State Library and Archives of Tasmania Zine Fair. It's a free event for all ages.




Make a zine!

The Tasmania Reads zine template can be printed as A3 or A4 size but must be printed as landscape. The cover page has a logo and the back page has a small line of text. This will be important when you fold it.

1 Fold your template into quarters.



2 Fold each side into the middle so you end up with eight sections.



3 Fold in half sideways and cut along the fold where the dotted line is shown.



4 Unfold your sheet.



5 Fold it in half longways and push it in so it forms a box.



6 Fold it flat so you can see the back page and the front cover.



7 Keep folding the pages until you have a book. The Tasmania Reads logo should be showing on your cover page. Have fun creating your zine!
