Did you know

Dash the Robot interacts with the environment around it through a variety of inbuilt sensors. These include:

A Gyroscope and accelerometer for moving around and balancing.

IR proximity sensors to stop it from smashing into things accidentally

Several microphones for detecting and moving to noises, which is cool since the robot can turn and come to the speaker giving it an almost pet like personality.

Positional sensors for accuracy in movement and balance

Fun Fact

Fusible beads have been around since the late 50s, making them nearly 60 years old today! And we have Sweden to thank for it!

Although beads made out of synthetic materials, like ceramics or glass, have been around for quite a while, the plastic toy kind, made by chopping plastic tubes into short pieces, was introduced in 1958 by the Munkplast AB company in Munka-Ljungby, Sweden. Referred to at that time as a type of Indian bead, they were originally sewn together to form ribbons.

Hema Beads, also known as melty or Perler beads, are small plastic beads which are arranged on a pegboard and then ironed so that the melted beads fuse together. You can create all sorts of pictures with differently shaped pegboards or you can design almost anything using a basic square board.











Sora The student reading app



What is Sora?

Sora is a reading app for students, by OverDrive.

Using Sora, students can borrow eBooks and eAudiobooks from their school's library, for free.

About Sora in Tasmanian schools

In an Australian first, Libraries Tasmania has worked with the State Government to bring Sora into Tasmanian government schools.

These schools can now access a large collection of eBooks, eAudiobooks, digital magazines, comics, graphic novels and levelled readers using Sora.

What types of items can students borrow?

The Sora collection includes a range of formats and titles to cater for students from Prep to Year 12.

Titles were chosen based on what is most popular in Libraries Tasmania's print and electronic collections, and in Sora collections in Australian schools.

The collection aims to support recreational reading; it does not include teaching and learning resources.

To ensure students access age-appropriate content, they will only be able to see and borrow content that is mapped to their year level:

Year	Sora – Education Tasmania	OverDrive - Public library
K - 6	Juvenile	Juvenile
7 - 10	Juvenile and Young Adult	Juvenile and Young Adult
11 - 12	Juvenile, Young Adult and Adult	Juvenile and Young Adult


